Public holiday on September 22

Next Thursday, September 22, will be a one-off public holiday in South Australia, coinciding with a National Day of Mourning for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The Prime Minister announced the date yesterday and this has been endorsed by State Cabinet this morning.

Usual arrangements for public holidays will be in place, including the closure of schools, banks and the payment of public holiday penalty rates to workers, in accordance with their employment agreements.

Shop trading hours will be similar to Anzac Day, whereby shops stay closed until midday as a mark of respect. Larger shops in the city and suburbs will be permitted to open from 12pm to 9pm. An exemption to the Shop Trading Hours Act will be authorised for this purpose.

The State Government is currently working through arrangements in public hospitals to ensure as many elective surgeries can take place as possible. This is complicated by the closure of schools and childcare centres impacting health workers ability to attend work. Patients with bookings at public hospitals for next Thursday are advised to not contact their hospital until arrangements are in place, which will be finalised by Friday.
